**IAPMO Accepting Comments to Petitions Filed Relating  
to UMC TIA 009-18 and UMC TIA 001-21**

**Ontario, Calif. (March 11, 2022)** — In accordance with the IAPMO Regulations Governing Committee Projects, IAPMO is accepting responses to two petitions filed with the petitions clerk, which relate to the Standards Council decisions to deny UMC TIA 009-18 and UMC TIA 001-21 to the 2018 and 2021 editions of the *Uniform Mechanical Code (UMC®)*.
